



World's easiest fingerless gloves

This pattern describes how to make a pair of fingerless gloves/wristwarmers in custom size. You can use any yarn with a suitable hook. In the pictures below I use a sport weight acrylic yarn and a 4,0 mm hook. 1 ball (165 meters) was enough for making two gloves

You'll also need:

- measuring tape or a ruler
- 2 stitch markers
- needle for weaving in the ends
- scissors

Abbreviations (US)

st	stitch
ch	chain
sl st	slip stitch
hdc	half double crochet
blo	back loop only

Right and left glove both work up in the same way. You will find it helpful to write down the number of stitches and rows you make on your first glove

Pattern



Make a row of chains in the same length as you want for your gloves + ch 2

Row 1: Start in the 3rd ch from hook, 1 hdc in each ch. Turn

Row 2: ch 2 (=turning ch, do not count as a st), 1 hdc in each st in blo. Turn

Repeat row 2 until your work is approx as wide as your hand



Thumbhole: Mark the place where you want to make the thumbhole by placing a stitch marker on each side of your thumb (see pic above). Work as row 2 until you reach the first stitch marker. Chain the same number of stitches as you have between the markers. Skip the space between the markers and continue as row 2 from your second marker to end of row. Make sure your thumb fits in the hole



The next row is worked as row 2 until you reach the chain space, 1 hdc in each ch. Continue as row 2 to end of row



Repeat row 2 until your work is wide enough to fit around your hand. Join the sides with a row of sl st to form a tube. Do not work the sl st too tight. Turn the glove inside out. The seam should be on the inside of the glove



Cut yarn, weave in the ends. If you like you can decorate your gloves with an edging, an appliqué or embroidery

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
